8. I will involve myself in risky, godly sharing. I will at times step outside my "comfort zone" to spread the good news. If necessary, I'll use words.

9. I believe that the church should enable us to be honest about our problems and to find the solutions – together – in God. Committing to the church is to grow and watch how God works through challenges and failures.

10. I believe that my body is the temple of God. Therefore I will abstain from polluting His temple with gossip and negative talk.

11. Believing my church has been granted a distinctive, ennobling message, I will be grateful and humble.

12. I believe that the Bible, baptism, faith, obedience, and love are wonderful, but these cannot save me. Only Jesus, God's Son, saves me.

13. I believe that baptism is not the end. Baptism is the beginning. I will never let go of my Saviour. Never, never, never.

It Really is all about Jesus

THE BIBLE

How much of the Bible is inspired by God and what is it useful for? **2 Tim 3:16** (p846)

Why was the gospel of John (and the rest of the Bible) written? John 20:31 (p767)

John declares that it is all about Jesus and by believing in him we can have eternal life in his name. How is this possible?

THE GOSPEL.

When God created the world it was perfect in every way. Yet Adam and Eve sinned, and sin entered the world. How many people sinned?

Rom 5: 12 (p796) All have sinned. And the problem is that sin separates us from God, the one who gives us life.


What is the wages of sin? Romans 6:23a.

Yet the Bible tells us that there was someone who lived on this earth who was without sin. Who do you think this was?

Jesus lived a sinless life (see Heb 4:15) so he didn't deserve the wages of sin or death. Yet here is the thing. He died in our place. He was treated as we deserve, that we might be treated as He deserves. He suffered the death which was ours, that we might receive the life which was his.

What is the gift of God mentioned in Romans 6:23b?

Wow! Ephesians tells us that it is by Grace that we have been saved through faith or believing in God. We can't earn salvation—it is a free gift given to those who believe in Jesus.

8. I believe God gives us special abilities to His people, and that the Spirit of prophecy is given to His chosen people.
9. I want to help God's church with my influence, effort and money.
10. I want to take good care of my body because the Holy Spirit lives there now.
11. With God's power, I want to obey the basic principles of the Sev- enth-day Adventist Church.
12. I want to be baptized to show people I am a Christian
13. I want to be a member of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, and I believe this church has a special message to give to the world.


Keeping his commandments is so important that God's end-times people are described as those who keep the commandments of God and have the testimony of Jesus. (See Rev 12:17 and 14:12).

Lord of our talents. What spiritual gift are you using to serve him?



because Jesus has the power over death. After Jesus was crucified and buried, what did the angels say to the women who came to the tomb?


Luke 24:5-6. (p 746)

How important is the resurrection of Jesus. 1 Corinthians 15:14,17 (p 813)

But Jesus did rise from the grave. Again we see that it is all about Jesus. He can raise the dead to life, he himself defeated death, and the same spirit that rose him now lives in us!

We don't have to be downhearted or discouraged because of Jesus and the spirit we have within us. In fact what does the Bible say that we can now do through Christ. Phil 4:13 (p 832)




The Lord who is returning.

We need these words of encouragement because things are not going very well in this world. We hear of wars and earthquakes and of pain suffering and death. But Jesus said that this is a sign that he is about to come back.

Who does the Bible say will come down from heaven?

1st Thess 4:16 (p838) _____

It's the Lord Jesus himself. He is coming back, and when he does those who have fallen asleep in him, will rise to meet him in the air, then we who are alive will follow suit. We will get to see our loved ones again, we will be with Jesus. Revelation tells us that there will be no more crying, sorrow or pain, we will be with the Lord.
