

The Bible

Have you ever wanted to talk with God? What about letting God talk to you? Since God made us, there is something deep inside us that doesn't feel right until we're in touch with Him. One of the key ways that God communicates to us is through the Bible.



The Bible is a library of 66 books. The first five books of the Bible were written by the prophet Moses, approximately 1,500 years later, with contributions by about 40 other prophets and writers, John the Revelator finished writing the last book found in the Bible.

The other key way to communicate with God is through prayer. Prayer is opening up your heart through talking to God, just like you would talk to a friend.


What do you think happens when we pray? Write some of your thoughts below.

Matthew 6:7, 9-15 _____

This prayer has the follow elements 1) Praise or adoration to God, 2) Saying that we want God's will to be done in our lives 3) Asking God to give us the things that we need 4) Telling God that we are sorry for the wrong things that we have done 5) Asking Him to forgive us from those things, and 6) Asking God to protect us.



The prayers you say to God can be short, at other times they will be longer, it isn't limited to formal words you say when kneeling, with hands folded and eyes closed—although that's a type of prayer also. But the most important thing about prayer, it that you simply do it.
