



Growing out of the work of Alwyn Salom, Graeme Christian, Graeme Bradford, Jorge Munoz, Russ Willcocks and others the AUC Ministerial Association advisory has developed a competency based approach to Ministerial Development [MD].

MD is an alignment of tools and experiences that engages the minister in conversations, resources and planning with a focus on personal and professional growth in a supportive environment.

Currently the MD process is being trialed in the SQLD Conferences and in a range of pastoral settings across our Union. The SPD, working through Adventist Media and SPD IT, are currently putting significant time and resources into the IT requirements of MD. In 2018 more pastors will be able to join in the MD trial before a wider launch in 2019.

The Ministry Ingredients

MD shapes it's conversations and resources around seven primary competency ingredients.

CENTRE

Healthy ministers are intentional about a vital connection with God that shapes Christ-centred values, attitudes and beliefs.

At the centre is a healthy connection with God. This is vital for healthy ministry and all pastoral functions need to be based on and grow out of this core.

The centre circle is about who the pastor is to be. We believe healthy pastoral ministry flows from a healthy relationship with God. This includes having a healthy picture of God and what it means to be called by Him to Adventist Pastoral Ministry.

Vital to this connection are intentional heart-building practices. Foundational practices include:

- Prayer (Private/family/congregational)
- Growing in God's Word Bible study •
- Introspection quiet time with God
- Private and Family Devotional/Worship practices

PASTORAL COMPETENCIES GROWING **OUT OF BEING HEALTHY IN CHRIST:**

I. Spiritually Dependent Self-Leadership - Stewarding

The minister is a person of prayer and Bible study who is able to exemplify a personal relationship with God through faith in Jesus - ministering out of the overflow of the time spent with Christ. A healthy pastor is committed to his or her family and exercises spiritually dependent leadership in family life and in the life of the church.

2. Spirit-Driven Leadership - Leading

The minister will diligently seek God's leading to collaboratively shape and cast vision, then drive the movement toward church health and an outward focus.

As a diligent and careful student of the Word the healthy minister has a thorough understanding of the Biblical message and enjoys continuous growth and learning. This results in the modelling and teaching of a biblical worldview.

4. Relational Wisdom - Shepherding

A healthy minister is socially and emotionally intelligent; skilled in inter-generational and inter-personal relations.

5. Communication - Communicating

The minister seeks to become proficient in communicating the Gospel in a manner that captivates the attention of the hearers and leads to a life-long commitment to Christ. This includes visitation, small groups and preaching.

6. Management - Managing

The minister is able to adapt to various situations and possesses the attitude and education that enables him or her to successfully lead the operation of a local church. The minister is well organized and able to administer time and available resources.



7. Training & Equipping - Empowering

The healthy pastor has a desire to grow people in ministry. This includes identifying giftedness and heart for ministry and then facilitating growth opportunities as part of resourcing/learning discipleship environment for church leaders.



Core Ministry Functions

The 5 Sauces and Their Ingredients for Pastoral Ministry

The 'ingredients' for ministry mix together to make our 5 basic ministry 'sauces'. Every Pastor should be able to produce the 5 key sauces of pastoral ministry - full of goodness and flavour so that they are tasty and nourishing! If local church leadership were a kitchen and the pastor was the chef, then the 5 sauces of Pastoral ministry are:




THE FIVE SAUCES

- 2. Preaching/Teaching
- 3. Effectivness in Evangelism
- 4. Bible Studies
- 5. Healthy Church Leadership

MD is not about something extra but rather clarifying what we already do in ministry for more effectiveness. It is not to be a burdensome add on but rather a positive, supportive process for development that grows our team personally and professionally.

2pm The Divinity of Jesus Part 1: Identifying the Issues Dr Cedric Vine

DID YOU KNOW THAT A CHILD'S WORLDVIEW is already shaped by the time they are seven? When it comes to shaping faith, there is no such thing as just babysitting. From Beginners right through to teens the picture a young person has of God is being shaped. What happens in the home, school, Sabbath School and local church is vital in helping to shape a life-long connection with God. This church is only ever one generation from extinction.

Around our Union in various forums the issue of faith development of our young people, particularly in terms of remaining active in the church community, is being discussed and addressed. Youth engagement has been listed as one of the core challenges our Union faces and the answers will take all of us.

At our Empower Minister's Convention we are making youth retention a focus area in the lead up to the Youth Engagement Summit which will be held May 25-27 2018. Our Children's/Youth/Young Adult workshop stream will be focusing on the youth engagement and retention challenges. We have invited Pr Benjamin Lundquist, an innovative youth/young adult specialist to be one of our international guests at our meetings. Benjamin is a certified speaker for the Fuller Youth Institute's Growing Young Project for the Seventh-day Adventist Church. On Thursday morning Terry Williams, from

Scripture Union, will address us about the key findings of the inter-denominational Here2Stay research.

These presentations and workshops are part of the lead up to The Youth Retention and Faith Summit in May which aims to join the dots between groups already working through the issues while highlighting implications for the whole church family. It will work toward and foster implementation of recommendations that will make our church community more conducive to the healthy faith development of our young people.

It's about synergy and how ministries work together to develop plans that work across ministries and departments. The overall strategy will include conference departments, pastors and local church leadership teams, teachers and parents combining ideas and resources to stimulate positive faith development.

The Live More Project has been developed in response to the increasing rates of stress, anxiety and depression in our Church and community.

The 10-part video series, features Dr Darren Morton, Senior Lecturer for Lifestyle Medicine at Avondale College of Higher Education. This innovative project takes the latest in lifestyle medicine, positive psychology and neuroscience to give you practical evidence-based strategies to increase vitality, mental health and reduce stress, anxiety and depression indicators, so you can live your best life.

"Mental health is an area that we have not dealt with before as a Church but there is a great need in the community. According to the latest Australian Psychological Society of National Stress and Wellbeing Survey, 1 in 10 adults in Australia are on anti-depressants, and anxiety symptoms were the highest they have ever been in the five years of the survey," said Dr Darren Morton.

Emotional wellness is a significant community need. The Live More Project is one tool that can be used to help us build relationships, and learn how we can meet further needs in the community.

- Engages with the wellness concerns of millennials.


The 7 Dimensions of Wellness will be available in website and app format as a free digital resource for the community, enabling them to find and connect to local Churches who are running wellness programs.

As a Ministerial Association, our aim at Empower is to honour and recalibrate around that calling to ministry and create an environment that inspires and refreshes our ministerial passions along with sharpening our gifts and competencies for effective ministry.

Our theme is based on Paul's prayer of empowerment in Ephesians 3:14-21(e3). Our focus for Empower is on growing our roots deep into Jesus and how God can do more than we can possibly imagine. Sabbath morning is a highlight with the Institute of worship orchestra while Sabbath afternoon is time to take a break, sit and chat, take a walk to Sunnyside or look through the art displays before Evensong and closing Sabbath.

The planning for Empower has include a lot of prayer and dedicated people. We have an excellent team of conference ministerial secretaries who have put a lot of time into this program. Our AUC team have been very supportive particularly Jacqui Wall, who has worked many hours beyond a usual work day to make sure registrations are sorted and that details are followed through, and Jessica Symes who has looked after the graphic design and more.

In 2018 our ministerial association will continue work on implementing the MD process, intern development, resource sharing and implementing our strategy to support chaplains more effectively. Check the website for updates and for our ministerial webinars.
