The Primary kids love Chapel. A huge focus for me has been to relieve the pressure from teachers who in the p ast have carried the load of running Primary Chapel, particularly Year 6 teachers. That has been greatly apprec iated and I've been able to mentor Year 6 students into their leadership roles. They are a vibrant class so it's be en a joy to see them step up into leadership and enthusiastically lead their peers in worship.

HIGH SCHOOL NOTES ON THEMES/INITIATIVES THIS TERM EFFECTIVENESS ADJUSTMENTS PLANNED

The theme for the year is "Taste and See that the Lord is Good". We've had a variety of speakers take Chapel and our WOW speaker was excellent. We have 5 Chapel Teams with 12+ students involved from Years 7-12. Two senior students are team leaders. This has been brilliant as the students have taken ownership. I've provided a range of support from just a sounding board to helping them pull the programs together, but it 's been great to see the buy-in by almost half of the High School students. The Chapel teams have appreciated the introduction of Proclaim as our worship software as it has allowed us to have professional presentations with easy access to song lyrics.



GENERAL COMMENTS

It's sometimes hard to get a 'buzz' happening in High School Chapel. Students are more reserved and staff hav e more stringent expectations for behaviour in Chapel so it can be difficult to get engagement. The Chapel Ban d is lacking a bit of leadership and commitment from both staff and students, largely due to the workload ever yone is experiencing.
